It is estimated that Problem Gambling effects more than 300,000 citizens in Pennsylvania.

With the recent expansion in our state of Act 42 of 2017, the impact of problem gambling is expected to grow even more. It is imperative that Pennsylvania continues its efforts to expand treatment for individuals with a gambling disorder, and their families.

The Department offers a ten year grant agreement opportunity to eligible treatment providers. The grant agreement offers treatment funding for uninsured and underinsured individuals throughout the state.

More about the grant agreement

Eligibility

To be eligible for the grant agreement you must be at least one of the following mental health or drug & alcohol provider types:

- PA licensed physician specializing in mental health disorders, psychologist, social worker, marriage and family therapist, or professional counselor
- A drug and alcohol counselor, project director, agency director, or clinical supervisor that is employed by an agency licensed by the department

AND you must have one of the following:

- 30 hours of Level 1 Gambling training
- Certificate of Competency in Problem Gambling issued by the PA Certification Board (PCB)
- Certified Addictions Specialist (CAS) with a specialization in Gambling Addiction
- Certification as an International Certified Gambling Counselor (ICGC Level I or II)



Benefits of the Grant Agreement

- Reimbursement at \$85 per individual outpatient session and \$35 per group outpatient session
- Timely reimbursement
- Referrals from 1-800-GAMBLER and the department's Get Help Now website
- One on one department support and resources
- Funding for clients without the ability to pay for their treatment

2. Submit an application
3. Sign the grant agreement
4. Start treating clients
