This curriculum will review up to date principles, terminology, screening, assessment, treatment considerations, and programming guidelines. This interactive program will engage participants through discussion and small group exercise. This 6-hour virtual course is divided into 2 parts in DDAP's Training Management System. Participants of this course will:

- Describe the foundations of integrated treatment
- Highlight key treatment considerations
- Employ screening and assessment for COD
- Critique Integrated treatment plans
